Income Tax Filing Options

City income tax returns are due Wednesday, July 15, 2020. Although the building remains closed to the public due to the pandemic, there are several options available for taxpayers to remit their returns to the city.

1. Those needing assistance with completing their tax forms, should contact the Revenue Collection Department at 937.498.8114 to schedule an appointment.
2. If you have a completed tax return, you may:
 - Use the drop box located outside the main entrance to City Hall. (No receipt will be given but the drop box contents are removed every 30 minutes during business hours).
 - Take it to the City Hall door facing the corner of Poplar and West (across from The Bridge restaurant). A receipt will be given showing that your tax return has been received. This temporary location will be available Monday, July 13

through Wednesday, July 15 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Only one person will be admitted into the building at a time. Pandemic screening precautions will be in place. Staff at the temporary location, will not be able to assist with completing returns. **Appointments must be made for tax preparation assistance.**

3. Returns may be mailed to the City of Sidney at 201 W. Poplar St., Sidney, OH 45365 and must be postmarked no later than July 15, 2020.

Taxpayers must include a copy of their Federal 1040 form, all W-2s and 1099-Misc forms with their city returns.

Lines outside City Hall near Tax Day are typically longer than normal. Those waiting in line should continue to practice social distancing by remaining at least six feet away from others in line.



Residential Swimming Pools on the Rise

10 Permanent Pool Permits Issued to Date

A total of 275 permits have been issued by the Community Development Department as of June 30, 2020; 172 of those permits were issued in the second quarter alone. Staff has seen a dramatic increase in the number of permanent, private swimming pool permits. In the first six months of 2020, 10 permanent pool or hot tub permits were issued.

Only two permanent pool or hot tub permits were issued in 2019 during the same time period, and three in 2018.

Community Development staff also reports that six new single family housing building permits have been issued to date in 2020; that number is equal to the number of new single

family building permits issued for all of 2019.

A full year-to-date report from the Community Development Department is included with this newsletter. In addition to permit information, you'll find details on code enforcement and vacant property activities for the first six months of 2020.



Not All Mosquitoes are the Same

City Began Community-Wide Spraying in June

Not all mosquitoes are the same and mosquito bites can be more than just annoying and itchy. Different mosquitoes spread different diseases and bite at different times of the day. Some mosquitoes such as those that bite during the day can spread viruses like the Zika virus. Others, that bite most often at dusk or dawn, can transmit the West Nile virus. Only a few of the 59 species of mosquitoes in Ohio can transmit disease.

Staff has been actively tracking mosquito counts since early June at five locations throughout the city. The 2020 threshold before spraying will begin is 15 mosquitoes per trap. A noticeable increase in mosquitoes was recorded, so staff began spraying insecticides from a truck throughout the community on June 9, 2020.

The city uses an integrated mosquito management program by

monitoring places where adult mosquitoes lay eggs, removing standing water that can attract mosquitoes, controlling mosquito larvae and pupae before they become adults and controlling the adult population by spraying adulticides. Effective July 6, 2020



How Can I Protect Myself and My Family?

Please review these facts about COVID-19 and the best ways to protect yourself and your family from the spread of the disease

- The Coronavirus is in the same family with the virus that causes the common cold.
- For the vast majority of the people who are positive for Coronavirus, they will only have the symptoms of a common cold. The people at the highest risk for complications are people over 60 and people who have other medical conditions such as diabetes, a heart condition or respiratory conditions.
- Practice social distancing, avoid crowds, avoid shaking hands and avoid touching your face, eyes, mouth, and nose.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, a hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol can be a good substitute.
- If you are not experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 a test will not be helpful. COVID-19 can only be confirmed if a person is having symptoms. A test to "rule out" Coronavirus is not helpful if a person is not having symptoms.
- The symptoms of coronavirus may include fever, shortness of breath, cough.
- The incubation period for COVID-19 is 2-14 days.
- There is no treatment or cure for the Coronavirus because it is a virus (like a cold), only the symptoms are treated.
- If you need to go to your doctor, please call ahead and let them know you are coming so they can be prepared for your arrival.
- If you are in medical distress, call 911.





Time will tell once we reach July 15, 2020.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT REPORT

JANUARY – JUNE 2020


A total of 172 permits were issued in the second quarter, including: 108 building permits and 64 zoning permits. 83% of the permits were issued in June. The number of permits issued for the first six months is within 5% of the permits issued in the same period previous years (if the Vectren gas meter change-out permits in 2016, 2017, and 2018 are removed from the count).




Violations for January through June totaled 854. A total of 251 high grass & unmanged vegetation violations were noted in May and June. Forty-eight of the high grass violations required mowing by the City's contractor, but property owners or occupants took care of 81% of the high grass before City contractor intervention was required.



There are currently 75 vacant properties. 29 are registered and 15 have been granted an exemption. City staff will seek to place a lien on the remaining 31 non-compliant properties. Foreclosure rates are being monitored closely due to recent economic impacts of COVID-19. With the vacant property registration program, the City will be in a better position to ensure that foreclosed properties are not allowed to deteriorate and cause neighborhood blight.

With well over 400 acres of parkland, you have the chance to spend time in Sidney's beautiful parks, while enjoying your favorite pastime.

Guidelines:

- Amateur photographers only (as a guideline, if you earn over \$2000.00 per year in photographic sales, please do not enter this contest)
- No employees or family members of the Recreation Board or City of Sidney are eligible to participate
- Only one photo per person per category (four total)
- Person entering the photo must be the photographer and must have rights to the photo
- All photos must be taken within the boundaries of City of Sidney owned park land
- Photos submitted become the property of the City of Sidney and can be used in promotional materials, the city calendar, local publications for articles relating to the City of Sidney and or its park system, on the city's social media, without fee or compensation.
- For a photo in which a person is recognizable, you must secure a model release from the subject. In the case of a minor, the subject's parent or guardian must sign such model release. Any such model release must be provided with the submitted photo. No photo in which a person is recognizable will be considered for award in the absence of such signed model release.
- Digital entries only (.jpg format, 300dpi)
- Only minimal photo alterations are allowed (cropping, red eye reduction and or adjustment of brightness, color and saturation)
- Do not break any laws or do anything unsafe when taking your photographs
- Do not photograph anything that is inappropriate, indecent or obscene
- No water marks or logos

Categories:

- **Wildlife** – Pictures of birds, wild animals, insects and other critters. No domestic animals.
- **Landscapes** – Pictures of the natural beauty in the city's parks and can include park structures
- **Flora** – Photos of plants, trees, flowers, etc., within the parks.
- **Adventure and outdoor recreation** – Photos of active recreation in the city parks: hiking, biking, running, soccer, baseball, football, boating/kayaking or fishing etc. Do not use photos that display people that are identifiable unless a Model Release for each identifiable person is completed

How to enter:

- Photos should be emailed to parks@sidneyoh.com and include a completed, scanned copy of the entry form. The photo file name should include SPRcontest_(category)_(subject)_(last name of photographer).

- Photos are due September 7, 2020 by 4:00 PM

Winning photos will be displayed at city hall on various bulletin boards, in the Sidney Senior Center foyer and on the city's Facebook page.

Judging:

Photos will be judged by the City of Sidney's Recreation Board members. First, second and third place will be chosen in each category. The first place winners in each category will be judged to determine "best of show" for the entire contest.

To report an outdoor or streetlight outage, please be prepared to provide the following information:


Select the Type of Outage:

- Pole down
- Other equipment issue
(example: pole or globe leaning)


Report the Light Location:

- Pole number





Mosquito facts

- Mosquitoes breed in water.



- Only female mosquitoes bite people.
 - She needs blood meals to develop her eggs.
 - Male mosquitoes feed on nectar.
- The female mosquito picks up a disease when she bites an infected animal or bird.
- Once infected, she will carry the disease for life.
- People become infected when bitten by an infected mosquito.
- Only a few of the 59 species of mosquitoes in Ohio can transmit disease. However, the diseases these mosquitoes can carry are very serious ones and include:
 - Eastern equine encephalitis
 - La Crosse encephalitis
 - St. Louis encephalitis
 - West Nile virus
- Most people infected with these diseases have no symptoms.
- Some people who are infected have a mild fever, headache and muscle aches that can last up to a week.
- A small number of infected people will develop severe illness requiring hospitalization. These people may have body aches, fever, confusion, weakness, stiff neck, tremors, convulsions and may die.


In Ohio, state and local governments follow a surveillance and response plan for West Nile virus and other mosquito-borne viruses. Control measures are used to try to reduce mosquito breeding without harming the environment.

You can support community-based mosquito control programs by preventing mosquito breeding on your property such as eliminating standing water.

Avoid mosquitoes

- Apply insect repellents on exposed skin registered with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Follow label instructions.
- Wear clothing treated with permethrin or another EPA-registered insect repellent. Follow label instructions.
- Wear light-colored clothing, long-sleeved shirts or jackets and long pants to protect against mosquito bites.
- Consider avoiding outdoor activities during peak mosquito biting hours. Take extra care to use insect repellent during these hours if outdoors.
- Use mosquito netting when sleeping outdoors or in an unscreened structure.



Plan ahead for mosquitoes when traveling

- Check travel notices on CDC's Travelers' Health website for mosquito-borne and other disease transmission updates for the country(ies) you are visiting.



- Speak to your healthcare provider about your travel plans. You may need malaria prophylaxis or yellow fever vaccination, depending on your destination.
- Pack appropriately to protect yourself from mosquitoes by bringing EPA-registered insect repellents, protective clothing and mosquito netting (if applicable).



Stop mosquitoes from breeding in and around your home

- Empty standing water from flowerpots, buckets, barrels, tarps/covers and wheel barrows on a regular basis.
- Discard trash such as tin cans, plastic containers and other water-holding containers that have accumulated on your property.
- Dispose of discarded tires properly. Drill holes in tire swings so water drains out.
- Change the water in pet dishes frequently.
- Replace the water in bird baths weekly.
- Check and clean clogged roof gutters at least twice annually so they will drain properly.
- Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with mosquito-eating fish.
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, even those that are not being used.
- Keep children's wading pools empty and on their sides when they aren't being used.
- Consider using products containing *Bacillus thuringiensis israelensis* (Bti), available at many garden and home improvement stores, to control mosquito larvae in containers that are too large to empty. Follow the label instructions.
- Install or repair screens on windows and doors.
- Use air conditioning, if you have it.



What You Need to Know About Truck Spraying



Mosquito control districts or local government departments track mosquito populations to learn where viruses, like Zika or West Nile, are spreading in a community. Spraying insecticides from a truck is one way to safely kill mosquitoes in an area, especially when people in the community are getting sick from mosquito bites. There are different types of sprayers that can be put on a truck.

Truck spraying is used to:

- ♦ Control and reduce the number of mosquitoes that can spread viruses.
- ♦ Reduce your chances of getting infected with viruses.

What are mosquito control trucks spraying?

Mosquito control trucks spray very small amounts of insecticide into the air to kill mosquitoes. This spray is a fine mist that acts as a fogger in the area. Mosquito control districts or local government departments will choose what type of insecticide to use in an area.

What does the insecticide spray do?

Adulticide sprays immediately kill flying mosquitoes. Larvicide sprays kill mosquito larvae that hatch from eggs and lasts longer than adulticide sprays. Both products will temporarily reduce mosquito populations in an area, but will not permanently get rid of them.

When does spraying occur?

Spraying takes place in the early evening when mosquitoes are more active. Often, local government agencies or mosquito control districts announce the dates and times of spraying in the local newspaper, on district websites, through public service announcements, by telephone, or through door-to-door notices.

How often do communities spray?

After spraying, mosquito control districts or local government departments will track mosquito populations and treat an area again as necessary to reduce the chances of people getting bitten by mosquitoes that can spread viruses.

Is the spray harmful to people, pets, animals, or the environment?

No, when done correctly, truck spraying will not harm people, pets, animals, or the environment.

What should I do during or after spraying?

Spraying is safe. You do not need to leave an area when truck spraying for mosquito control takes place. If you prefer to stay inside and close windows and doors when spraying takes place you can, but it is not necessary. If you are having any type of health problems after spraying, contact your doctor or healthcare provider. The spray does not harm pets, but you may choose to bring them inside when spraying occurs.



State Route 47 Safety Improvements, PH IV (I-75 – 4th Avenue)
ODOT PID 112179

PUBLIC MEETING

Tuesday, July 14, 2020; 5:30 p.m.
Sidney Municipal Building, 201 W. Poplar Street, Sidney, Ohio

The City of Sidney proposes to improve State Route 47 (Michigan Avenue/Court Street) from Interstate 75 to Fourth Avenue. The project is intended to improve safety within the corridor, by addressing conditions contributing to a high frequency of crashes (including crashes involving pedestrians and cyclists). The project, as proposed, will include the following improvements:

- Provide a raised concrete median between Fourth Avenue and Sixth Avenue, to prevent cross-over crashes and better define the left turn lanes. The existing guardrail between Fourth Avenue and Fifth Avenue will be eliminated. The median will extend through the Fifth Avenue intersection, preventing left turns to/from Fifth Avenue. The left turn movement from State Route 47 to American Trim/Wendy's Restaurant will be retained.
- Upgrade the traffic signal at Sixth Avenue and State Route 47, including new mast arms and backplates. Improvements at this intersection will include minor widening to allow a U-Turn movement from westbound State Route 47 to eastbound State Route 47, to accommodate southbound Fifth Avenue traffic seeking to head eastbound on State Route 47.
- Provide a 10-foot shared use path on the south side of State Route 47 from the existing crosswalk at the I-75 northbound exit ramp to Fourth Avenue.
- Upgrade pedestrian crossings at I-75 and Sixth Avenue to offer countdown pedestrian signal heads and enhanced visibility crosswalks.
- Close three of five driveways at American Trim. The main driveway opposite Sixth Street and the east-most driveway will be retained.
- Provide street lights and upgrade signage.
- Resurface the corridor and replace drive aprons as needed.

The project is expected to occur primarily within the existing public right-of-way, although minor temporary right-of-way up to 0.3 acre may be necessary to allow for construction access and grading. No permanent acquisition is anticipated.

Construction is expected to begin in spring of 2022 and require up to 9 months to construct. Traffic on State Route 47 will be maintained during construction, although lane closures and detours may be required. No impact to existing utilities is expected.

The project corridor is a mix of commercial and manufacturing/light industrial development that generally dates to the mid-20th century. Within the project limits, there are no National Historic Landmarks, sites listed or known eligible for the National Register of Historic Places, or sites for which Ohio Historic/Archaeological Inventory forms have been completed.

Within the census blocks that include the project corridor, minorities represent 4% to 23% of the population; individuals in poverty represent 17% to 45% of the population.

There are no wetlands or waterways within the proposed construction limits. Tree removals, if any, will be limited to isolated lawn trees. The project is not located within a designated special flood hazard area.

The project will be constructed with Federal safety funds and local funding. The current estimated construction cost is \$2.5-million. Environmental clearance is scheduled for 04/01/2021. The anticipated award date is 01/12/2022.

A Public Meeting with property owners was previously held on September 13, 2018 to discuss the proposed preliminary project and answer questions or concerns that were presented. The project is now in the Stage 1 design phase.

The environmental review, consultation and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been carried out by ODOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated 12/11/2015, and executed by FHWA and ODOT.
